5.1 MAJOR PROJECTS - GRANT FUNDED PROJECTS FOR LACHLAN SHIRE COUNCIL - ENGAGEMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

PURPOSE

To advise Councillors of communication with New South Wales Government representatives since the Ordinary Meeting of Council on 11 December 2019.

To seek a resolution from Council that an application be made to the Minister for Water, Property & Housing for the construction of grant funded water supply and sewerage projects.

BACKGROUND

Council has been previously informed by reports to Council regarding the Restart NSW grants awarded, progress on projects funded by those grants, the Restart NSW audit report into those projects and Council obligations to co-contribute towards those projects.

ISSUES AND COMMENTS

Since the last Ordinary Meeting of Council on 11 December 2019, there have been conversations between Council senior staff and representatives of the Department of Planning, Industry & Environment and Restart NSW. These discussions have been around the Restart NSW audit report, Council staff's responses, the difficulties Council has experienced in attracting and retaining suitably qualified and experienced professional staff and alternatives to staff recruitment for Lachlan Shire Council.

Those conversations have led to discussions around how Lachlan Shire Council can get project management support to deliver existing and potential capital works projects for water and sewerage infrastructure. Such projects include:

RNSW755 Condobolin Borefields II Project (Stage 1)

RNSW841 Tottenham Water Security Project

RNSW842 Effluent Management Systems Project

Condobolin Sewerage Treatment Plant Replacement

Condobolin Water Treatment Plant Upgrade or Replacement

Condobolin Borefields II Project (Stage 2)

B-Section Pipeline Collaboration Project

FINANCIAL AND RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

Financial implications of grant funded projects and associated co-contributions have been explained in report to Council R19/305 RNSW841 Tottenham Water Security Project & RNSW842 Effluent Management System Project – Funding for Council Co-contributions dated 11 December 2019.

Challenges in resourcing for project management and professional staff has been explained in report to Council R19/323 Major Projects – Restart NSW Audit Report – Grand Funded Projects for Lachlan Shire Council.

Should the Minister agree to the construction of these works under the Public Works Act 1912, it would mean the appointment of Public Works Advisory as project managers, with responsibility for development and delivery of the works. Council would need to continue to source funding for these works. See Legal Implications below. Council would need to ask Public Works Advisory to assist with that.

LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Application to the Minister for the works to be constructed under the Public Works Act 1912, is legislated under Section 57 of the Local Government Act 1993. Sections 58 and 59 are also relevant to Council should the application be successful. Refer excerpts below:

57 Construction of works

- (1) The Minister for Primary Industries may, on the application of one or more councils, construct works of water supply, sewerage or stormwater drainage under the Public Works Act 1912.
- (2) The Minister for Primary Industries may agree to the construction of the works by the council or councils concerned on the Minister's behalf.

58 Handing over of works

- (1) The Minister for Primary Industries may, on or before the completion of any such works, by notice given to the council or councils concerned, charge the council or councils with the care and management of the whole or part of the works (and of land on which the works are, or are being, constructed).
- (2) The notice may include provisions relating to the responsibility of the council or councils concerned for financial costs associated with the works.
- (3) The notice has effect according to its tenor from the date the notice is given to the council or councils concerned.
- (4) If more than one council is charged with the care and management of works, each council may be charged with the care and management of a specified portion of the works or the councils may be charged jointly as to the whole or a specified portion.

59 Vesting of works

- (1) The Minister for Primary Industries may, by notice published in the Gazette, do either or both of the following--
- (a) declare that land acquired for the purposes of any such works, or any part of the works, is vested in the council or councils,
- (b) declare that all right, title and interest of the Minister in any such works, or part of the works, are vested in the council or councils.

- (2) The notice has effect according to its tenor from the date the notice is published in the Gazette.
- (3) If, on the date on which a notice under this section is published in the Gazette, the council or councils concerned have not made all payments to the Minister that may finally be required to be made in respect of the cost of the acquisition of the land and of constructing the works, or part of the works (whether or not that cost has been finally determined), the council or councils concerned continue to be liable to make those payments.

RISK IMPLICATIONS

There is the risk that the cost of the works by Public Works Advisory exceed available grant funding and Council's co-contributions. In accordance with Section 58 (2) the Minister may, by notice given to the Council, levy the Council for the cost of the works:

(2) The notice may include provisions relating to the responsibility of the council or councils concerned for financial costs associated with the works.

Council will need to make sure that Public Works Advisory advises Council of cost forecasts for the works and any grant opportunities to cover any additional costs which are over and above existing funds (including grants) for the projects. It is expected that Public Works Advisory will have a close relationship with grant bodies through their role delivering these works.

OPTIONS

Council has the option of trying to develop and deliver its grant funded water and sewer capital works projects and risk ongoing under performance and potential loss of grant funds.

Alternatively, Council has the option of applying to the Minister for construction of these works under the Public Works Act 1912 and eliminate the risk of ongoing under performance and potential loss of grant funds.

Council does not have the option of outsourcing the development and delivery of these works by engaging project management consultants as there is inadequate funding in these projects to carry this cost.

CONCLUSION

It is recommended that Council resolve to make an application to the Minister for Water, Property & Housing for the construction of Council's grant funded water supply and sewerage projects under the Public Works Act 1912.
